Lucky Town is Portland, Oregon's Bruce Springsteen tribute band. Bruce Springsteen (The Boss) has sold more than 135 million records worldwide and more than 64 million records in the United States, making him one of the worlds best selling artist of all time. He has earned numerous awards for his work, including 20 Grammy Awards, two Golden Globes, an Academy Award, a Tony Award (for Springsteen on Broadway) as well as being inducted into both the Songwriters Hall of Fame and the

Rock And Roll Hall Of Fame in 1999. In 2009, Springsteen was a Kennedy Center Honors recipient, in 2013 was named MusiCares person of the year, and in 2016 was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom

Justin Sheehy (Guitar, Lead vocals)

Justin Sheehy hails from the Washington DC area, and spent his time developing musically in bands, finally digging in with his band Jonasay, a four-piece pop rock outfit led by Justin's soulful crooning and smart, catchy songwriting. Jonasay secured a management and recording contract, and toured relentlessly, opening for nationals such as Sister Hazel, Hootie and the Blowfish, Edwin McCain and many others. Disbanding in 2005 Justin headed west and spend a decade in Los Angeles, where he continued to hone his craft as a songwriter and performer. In 2013 Just decided to make the move to Portland, where he set up his studio and continues performing regularly as a solo artist. Being asked to play Bruce in this tribute was an exciting moment for me," says Justin. "Springsteen has always been an influence, not only his style of songwriting and singing, but also his amazing dedication and work ethic!"

Michael Suffin (Guitar, vocals)

Micheal covers the guitar parts of Stevie Van Zandt and Nils Lofgren. A native Californian, Micheal has 35+ years experience playing in some of the Northwests most popular bands. With his stage presence and enthusiasm, he's guaranteed to keep you captivated and engaged.

David Stenson (Bass guitar, vocals)

David, raised in the SF Bay Area, is the original Bassist for the pop group The Grass Roots. He performed regularly in Los Angeles on the Sunset Strip in clubs sharing the bill with The Lovin Spoonful, The Byrds and Marvin Gaye. While in LA he also worked in the backup band for The Mama's and the Papa's, Barry McGuire and Dobbie Gray. He appeared on the TV shows Shindig, Dick Clark's Were The Action Is and the Ed Sullivan Show. After moving back home to San Francisco David and the Grass Roots performed at the Fillmore Auditorium with the Grateful Dead, Janice Joplin and Big Brother, Quicksilver and The Association. After leaving the Roots David recorded with poet David Meltzer's Serpent Power. That recording was voted by Rolling Stone Magazine to be one of the top recordings of 1967. After moving to Portland, David has kept busy playing with a quiver of local artists, his own combo (Gunga Dave Band) and fiddeling around in his home studio, Gunga's Garage.

Becky Pershing (Background vocals)

Becky plays the role of Bruce's Patti Scialfa's. With 25 years experience, perfect harmonies and stage presence she will capture your heart and soul. Becky also plays with the Squabble.

Greg Keyser (Keyboards, vocals)

Greg plays the role of Roy Bittan (The Professor). Greg has over 35 years experience and captures all the favorite keys of Bruce's best arranged material. Greg also plays in other bands around the Portland area.

Steven Shroy (Drums)

Steve started playing professionally at the age of 12 and was on the road by the age of 16 playing everything from nightclubs to large venues. Since then he has the pleasure to play with many accomplished bands including The Coasters, The Hager Twins (*Hee Haw*) as well as played along side many successful players that have played with the likes of Joe Cocker, Lindsay Buckingham, Tammy Wynett, Buck Owens, California Raisins and many more. He played with Dave Berg, a 2009 ASCAP songwriter of the year from 1997-2004. Steve has also shared the stage along side with Howard Jones on a special occasion. Steve is a sub drummer for the Petty Fever, a Tribute to Tom Petty and plays with multiple other local acts around the Portland metropolitan area.

Steven Strain (Saxophone)

Steve captures all the famous hook lines and sax solo's of Clarence Clemons (RIP) with passion. Steve has 30+ years experience playing in some of Portland's best dance bands. Steve also played in the Mt. Hood Community College and Clackamas Community College Jazz bands as well as many local bands including Spinnaker, Power of Ten, Back Alley, Mixed Company and Sh-Boom. Steve also played sax and keyboards in an original Rock & Roll band, Redeye.
